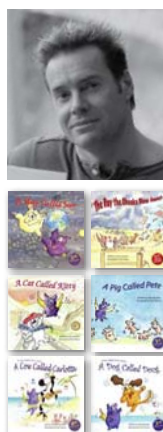


Children's Illustration Workshop with Pete Pascoe

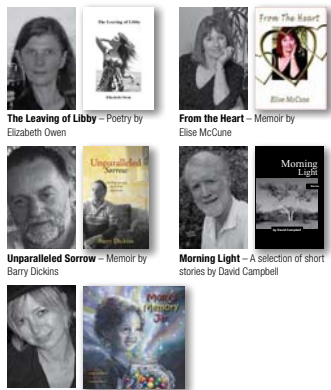

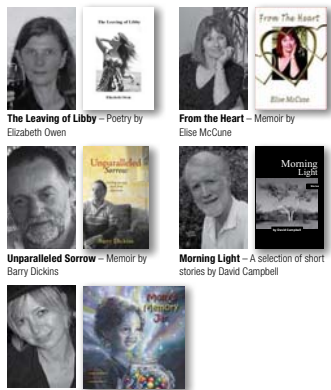
